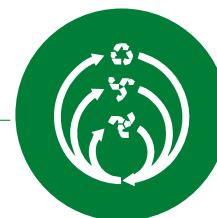

Programme Overview

The Nonprofit Leadership and Management Certificate Programme is a detailed introduction to Nonprofit Management that takes on a highly practical, experiential and interactive approach. 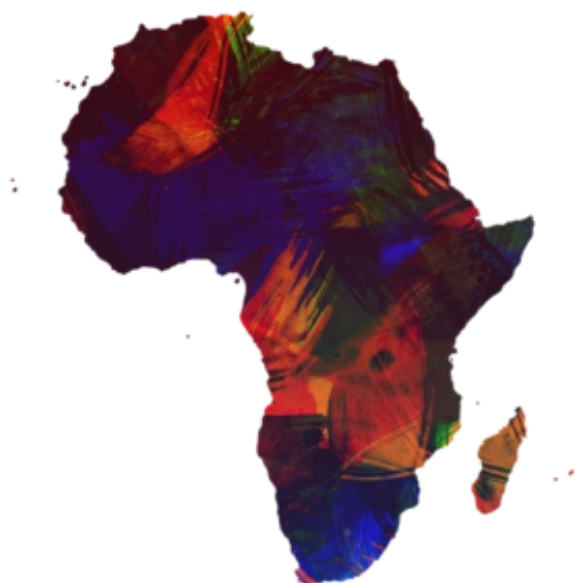


International Sustainability Conference

Circular Webinar series

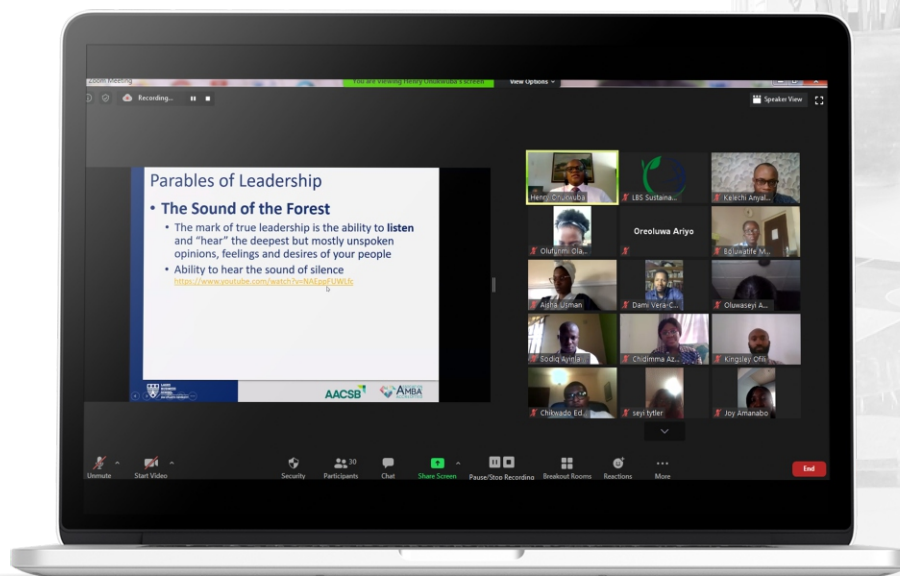
This is a series of open interactive live classes focused on educating the public on the need to develop sustainable production systems through the circular economy.
